TOP 10 BENEFITS OF HAVING OUR HOA

- 1. Abolishing the HOA will most likely have a negative effect on your property value.
- At \$300 per year in HOA dues this is <u>one of the best values in Eagle County</u>. Many developments charge that much or more per month.
- The HOA serves as a representative of all owners with the Town of Gypsum and the Gypsum Creek Golf Course when discussing plans that impact the community. This ensures that we have direct input into decisions that might benefit or detract from our community.
- Ensuring that design guidelines are met when building new homes or maintaining current ones has a direct effect on property values. Without our existing guidelines there will be dramatic shifts in the overall quality, look, and value of properties in the community.
- The HOA maintains the common area of the community. Because of this maintenance, one receives the feeling of a <u>quality</u> <u>development</u> when entering our neighborhood.
- The HOA contracts to plow the sidewalks during the winter months so residents may walk through our neighborhood safely. We also work with the town to address any street plowing issues that arise.
- The <u>dog stations throughout the community</u> are maintained by the HOA. Without dog stations, there would be nowhere for pet owners to dispose of their waste.
- A covenant enforcement person ensures that standards are met within the community and that all our neighbors are respecting our guidelines.
- The HOA is the only way to <u>collectively communicate with owners</u> and answer questions as they arise within the community. It is also able to communicate any concerns to the Town of Gypsum.
- The HOA acts as a <u>liaison with the Cotton Ranch Metro District</u> to communicate issues that arise with the non-potable water system and the pay off of bonds owed by the district.
